

**When you contract a school-regulated infectious disease or develop symptoms suggestive of one  
(Students in Medical and Dental Sciences)**

※Graduate students engaged in clinical duties at the hospital are required, in addition to the procedures below, to submit a report via the Slack channel “#an-Infection\_Control\_Department\_Hospital” under “Staff Health Monitoring.

Enrolled in hospital-based clinical training courses designated by each department/major\*

\*Classes involving contact with high-risk groups for infection

**●In the event that the student is found to have contracted a disease classified as a school-related infectious disease.**

**It will be regarded as a valid reason for an excused absence, and the approved period will be treated as a suspension from attendance (provided that the prescribed measures have been implemented).**

**To implement Measures 1 through 4**

**Measure 1** • At the initial consultation or a follow-up visit, bring the “School Infectious Disease Recovery Certificate (for Medical and Dental Programs)” and request that your attending physician complete it(a medical certificate may also be accepted if it covers all required items on the recovery certificate).

- Promptly report your absence to all contacts listed in the absence-notification directory.
- To refrain from attending school (or to leave promptly if already at school).

**Measure 2** • No action is required for Measure 2.

**Measure 3** • Promptly complete the 【Intended for medical and dental students】 Infection Report via MS Forms.

**Measure 4:** • Within five days after resuming attendance, submit the Excused Absence Notification with the required supporting documents attached to your Academic Affairs Group.

**●If a student exhibits any of the symptoms A, B, or C suggestive of a designated school infectious disease.**

**It will be considered a valid reason for an excused absence, and the approved period will be treated as a suspension from attendance (provided that the prescribed measures have been taken).**

**However, If a student seeks medical attention for symptoms suggestive of a school-related infectious disease, but the diagnosis does not confirm a disease classified as a school infectious disease, only hospital-based practical training courses designated by each department or program that fall within the period of attendance suspension will be treated as excused absences. All other courses, even if held on the same day, will be treated as regular absences.**

**To implement Measures 1 through 4**

〈Symptoms A Suggestive of a School Infectious Disease〉

Presence of any of the following: fever, throat discomfort, sore throat, nasal discharge, cough, sneezing, joint pain, muscle pain, or arthralgia.

〈Symptoms B Suggestive of a School Infectious Disease〉

Presence of any of the following: diarrhea, vomiting, or abdominal pain.

〈Symptoms C Suggestive of a School Infectious Disease〉

Presence of a rash accompanied by fever.

**Measure 1** • Promptly report your absence to all contacts listed in the absence-notification directory.

- To refrain from attending school (or to leave promptly if already at school)

**Measure 2** <Symptoms A suggesting a possible school-related infectious disease>

- After 24 hours from onset, promptly visit a medical institution and undergo testing for COVID-19 and influenza (during the epidemic season).
- If the symptoms are severe, it is acceptable to seek medical care even before 24 hours have passed since onset. However, tests conducted before the 24-hour mark are not considered valid, and a repeat test after 24 hours is required.
- At the initial consultation or a follow-up visit, bring the “School Infectious Disease Recovery Certificate (for Medical and Dental Programs)” and request that your attending physician complete it (a medical certificate may also be accepted if it includes all required items listed on the recovery certificate). (If there are no hospital-based practical training courses designated by the relevant department within 10 days, submission of the “Recovery Certificate” is not required) .
- Home testing 24 hours after the onset of symptoms is permitted, and a doctor's consultation is not required only if the test result for COVID-19 or influenza is positive (a test kit showing a positive result is required as supporting documentation).

<Symptoms B Suggestive of a School Infectious Disease> <Symptoms C Suggestive of a School Infectious Disease>

- Seek medical attention promptly.
- At the initial consultation or a follow-up visit, bring the “School Infectious Disease Recovery Certificate (for Medical and Dental Programs)” and request that your attending physician complete it (a medical certificate may also be accepted if it includes all required items listed on the recovery certificate). (If there are no hospital-based practical training courses designated by the relevant department within 10 days, submission of the “Recovery Certificate” is not required) .

**Measure 3** • Promptly complete the 【Intended for medical and dental students】 Infection Report via MS Forms.

**Measure 4:** • Within five days after resuming attendance, submit the Excused Absence Notification with the required supporting documents attached to your Academic Affairs Group.

**Not enrolled in hospital-based clinical training courses designated by each department/major\***

**\*Classes involving contact with high-risk groups for infection**

**Measure 2** • No action is required for Measure 2.



**Measure 3** • Promptly complete the **【Intended for medical and dental students】** Infection Report via MS Forms.

**Measure 4** • Within five days after resuming attendance, submit the Excused Absence Notification with the required supporting documents attached to your Academic Affairs Group.

**•When symptoms suggestive of a school-related infectious disease are present**

**This will not be considered an excused absence and will be treated as a regular absence.**

- We strongly recommend that you refrain from coming to school and monitor your condition at home.
- If you must come to campus, please wear a mask at all times and do not enter the university hospital. In addition, avoid contact with university personnel outside of class.
- We strongly recommend that you monitor your temperature regularly and seek medical attention if you develop a fever over 37.5°C or if there are COVID-19 or influenza cases among those around you
- If you undergo testing for COVID-19 or influenza, we recommend doing so at least 24 hours after the onset of symptoms (as testing earlier than 24 hours may result in a false negative).
