3. Aims of the course

This course aims to understand the worldwide developments in gastrointestinal or hepatic diseases. Article seminars are regularly held in Department of Specialized Surgeries or Gastroenterology and Hepatology at TMDU, reading the latest articles related to the advanced management for gastrointestinal or hepatic diseases. Students join the seminar and the discussion, as a presenter at times.

4. Course objectives

Students can acquire advanced information and knowledge in Surgery or Gastroenterology, which can be utilized in their research activities. Moreover, the discussion with the experts will provide students with opportunities to read scientific articles more critically and effectively.

5. Format

This course consists of regular study meetings in Department of Specialized Surgeries or Gastroenterology and Hepatology. Students are required to attend the meetings and the discussion constantly.

6. Class Detail

- Article seminar is a group discussion within the members from Department of Specialized Surgeries or Gastroenterology and Hepatology.
- One or two journal articles on gastrointestinal or hepatic diseases are selected to be discussed. A member of the meeting including students prepare a summary of the article and give a presentation.
- The seminar leads discussion about the structure, the importance and the novelty of the article on each field.
- The participation in each seminar will be evaluated as grade of the students. The final grade is determined from the statements that students make, from both qualitative and quantitative perspectives to assess the contribution to the discussion.

7. Assessment

An overall assessment comprising of class participation (knowledge and understanding of the specialty field, content of presentations and Q&A) (50%) and involvement in research (50%) will be made.
