
Discussions wishes medical care while individuals are still able to make own decisions (ACP*) will supports Tokyo residents' living quality. We plan to build a foundational practical ACP training for medical and nursing professionals by designing the learning systems "space" that provides relevant ACP-related information and collaborative learning.

Implementation Plan (2025-2027)

- ✓ To express personal medical care wishes (ACP) is to live a wishes end-of-life.
- ✓ Yet, healthcare professionals who support the decision-making process (ACP) among find it difficult to support these discussions.

ACP practice skills for medical and nursing professionals (overall picture)



*ACP : Advance care planning. A process in which a patient discusses wishes medical care with medical and nursing care professionals while still able to make decisions.

○Create a website that consolidates ACP information and create a collaborative learning space.

Conduct a survey among medical and nursing professionals regarding their ACP difficulties, success and failures. Create a "Web Information Room (tentative name)" which consolidates shared case studies, lecture videos, ACP-related information. Create a collaborative learning "space" where medical and nursing professionals can interact and learn about ACP practices

○Create a foundation for medical and nursing professionals to improve their ACP practice skills through experience.

Medical and nursing professionals use the "Web Information Room (tentative name)" to learn ACP individually, support (practice) ACP among Tokyo residents. They review their practice through collaborative learnings among professionals, and discuss any problems or challenges they may have. This forms the foundation for developing ACP practice skills of medical and nursing professionals."

Expected Outcomes to the project

- An established foundation to improve the ACP practice skills of medical and nursing care professionals who support the "living" quality of Tokyo residents to their end.
- Medical and nursing care professionals will have the means and a place to solve problems in ACP practice.
